**COMMISSIONERS COURT GRANTING AN EXEMPTION UNDER SECTION 262.024, LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE, FROM THE BIDDING REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 262.023, LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE, UPON THE COMMISSIONERS COURT FINDING THAT THE PURCHASE A THREE CAMERA VIDEO SYSTEM FOR LIVE STREAMING RECORDING, INDEXING AND REMOTELY CONTROLLED CAMERAS FROM SWAGIT PRODUCTIONS, L.L.C. IS AN ITEM THAT CAN BE OBTAINED FROM ONLY ONE SOURCE**

The Johnson County Commissioners Court met on August 10, 2015 in regular session for the consideration of the purchase of a three camera video system for live streaming recording, indexing, and remotely controlled cameras from Swagit Productions, L.L.C. is an item that can be obtained from only one source because of the existence of patents, copyrights, secret processes or monopolies. The Commissioners Court finds that this item can be obtained from only one source and that the Commissioners Court may grant an exemption under Section 262.024, Local Government Code, from the competitive bidding requirements of Section 262.023, Local Government Code.

A motion was made by Commissioner Jerry Stringer and seconded by Commissioner Larry Woolley that: "The Commissioners Court find the purchase of a three camera video system for live streaming recording, indexing, and remotely controlled cameras from Swagit Productions, L.L.C. is an item that can be obtained from only one source because of the existence of patents, copyrights, secret processes or monopolies, and that the Commissioners Court grant an exemption under Section 262.024, Local Government Code, from the competitive bidding requirements of Section 262.023, Local Government Code, and enter an order to that affect, and that the Commissioners Court approve the purchase as an item that can be obtained from only one source because of the existence of patents, copyrights, secret processes or monopolies.



**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED:**


