ORDER CREATING A LOCAL DATA ADVISORY BOARD

WHEREAS, Chapter 60 of the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure was amended by Senate Bill 1061 passed in the 81st Texas Legislature; and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1061 added Article 60.10 to Chapter 60 of the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure; and

WHEREAS, Article 60.10 became effective September 1, 2009 and requires a commissioners court of a county that has an average disposition completeness percentage of less than 90 percent to establish a local data advisory board not later than November 1, 2009; and

WHEREAS, the disposition completeness percentage for Johnson County is less than 90 percent; and

WHEREAS, the local data advisory board must prepare a data reporting improvement plan and submit said plan to the Department of Public Safety not later than June 1, 2010.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, that a Local Data Advisory Board is established for Johnson County, Texas which shall include the following:

1. The Sheriff of Johnson County, or the Sheriff's designee;
2. An attorney who represents the State in the District Courts of Johnson County;

3. An attorney who represents the State in the County Courts of Johnson County;
4. The District Clerk of Johnson County, or the District Clerk's designee;
5. The County Clerk of Johnson County or the County Clerk's designee;
6. The police chief of the City of Burleson, which is the municipality in Johnson County with the greatest population, or the chief's designee;
7. A representative of Johnson County's automated data processing services;
8. A representative of Net Data, which is the entity with whom Johnson County contracts for automated data processing services; and
9. The Director of Juvenile Services of Johnson County, or the Director's designee.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that the Local Data Advisory Board shall perform the following duties:

1. Analyze the structure of local automated and manual data systems to identify redundant data entry and data storage;
2. Develop recommendations for the commissioners to improve the local data systems;
3. Develop recommendations, when appropriate, for the effective electronic transfer or required data from local agencies to state agencies; and
4. Perform any related duties to be determined by the commissioners court.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that the Local Data Advisory Board shall prepare a data reporting improvement plan for Johnson County and include in said plan the following:


1. Describe the manner in which the county intends to improve the county's disposition completeness percentage;
2. Ensure that the county takes the steps necessary for the county's average disposition completeness percentage to be equal to or greater than 90 percent in the first report the Department of Public Safety submits under Article 60.21 (b) (2) on or after January 1, 2013; and
3. Include a comprehensive strategy by which the county will permanently maintain the county's disposition completeness percentage at or above 90 percent.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that the Local Data Advisory Board shall submit the data reporting improvement plan not later than June 1, 2010 to the Texas Department of Public Safety.






