**TEMPORARY WATER LINES
ON COUNTY RIGHT-OF-WAY**

REQUIREMENTS

1. Although the water lines will be placed in a County easement, the property still belongs to each individual landowner. It is the responsibility of the Permittee to obtain permission of each landowner to allow the lines to be placed. If the County receives complaints that lines were laid without permission, an effort will be made to assist the Permittee and landowner to reach an agreement. If this is not possible, the permit may be cancelled and the lines removed by the County.
2. To aid in visibility of the lines, the Permittee is responsible for mowing the easement where the water line is to be laid. Special attention should be taken around culverts, ditches, etc. to keep the lines visible. The grass and brush should remain cut throughout the period of the permit.
3. The lines should be attached to a fence line, trees, staked into position, or secured in some manner so as to not allow migration into the roadway. The lines should be kept as far away from the roadway as possible, but should never be within five feet (5') of the roadway.
4. Prior to installing lines through existing culverts, the culvert shall be cleared of all debris for its entire length and each end shaped into the original round or oval shape.
5. Prior to a permit being issued, the Permittee will provide at least one contact name and phone number that can provide 24 hour response to any emergency or issue involving the installed lines. Failure to respond to any emergency or issue may result in the cancellation of the permit and removal of the lines by the County.
6. Each permit will identify the ending date for the permit. Any lines still remaining after the permit expires will be considered abandoned and may be removed by the County.
