

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON TAX INCREASE

A tax rate of \$0.389276 per \$100 valuation has been proposed by the governing body of Johnson County.

PROPOSED TAX RATE	\$0.389276 per \$100
NO-NEW-REVENUE TAX RATE	\$0.375905 per \$100
VOTER-APPROVAL TAX RATE	\$0.419743 per \$100

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2025 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for Johnson County from the same properties in both the 2024 tax year and the 2025 tax year.

The voter-approval rate is the highest tax rate that Johnson County may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate.

The proposed tax rate is greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that Johnson County is proposing to increase property taxes for the 2025 tax year.

A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE WILL BE HELD ON September 8, 2025 AT 9:00 AM AT the Commissioners Courtroom, Johnson County Courthouse, 2 N. Main Street, Cleburne, TX.

The proposed tax rate is not greater than the voter-approval tax rate. As a result, Johnson County is not required to hold an election at which voters may accept or reject the proposed tax rate. However, you may express your support for or opposition to the proposed tax rate by contacting the members of the Commissioners Court of Johnson County at their offices or by attending the public hearing mentioned above.

YOUR TAXES OWED UNDER ANY OF THE RATES MENTIONED ABOVE CAN BE CALCULATED AS FOLLOWS:

$$\text{Property tax amount} = (\text{tax rate}) \times (\text{taxable value of your property}) / 100$$

The 86th Texas Legislature modified the manner in which the voter-approval tax rate is calculated to limit the rate of growth of property taxes in the state.

The following table compares the taxes imposed on the average residence homestead by Johnson County last year to the taxes proposed to be imposed on the average residence homestead by Johnson County this year.

No-New-Revenue Maintenance and Operations Rate Adjustments

Indigent Defense Compensation Expenditures

Johnson County spent \$1,578,278 from July 1, 2024 to June 30, 2025 to provide appointed counsel for indigent individuals in criminal or civil proceedings in accordance with the schedule of fees adopted under Article 26.05, Code of Criminal Procedure and to fund the operations of a public defender's office under Article 26.044, Code of Criminal Procedure, less the amount of any state grants received. For the current tax year, the amount of increase above last year's indigent defense compensation expenditures is \$7,963. This increased the no-new-revenue maintenance and operations rate by \$0.000037/\$100.
